The Aim and Purpose of APHTRO

APHTRO will mainly help the improvement of our treasured heritage railways and museums by forming a co-operative organisation to unite the countries. It will provide a forum where we can share experience and exchange ideas, advice and information from specialists in marketing, finance and technical aspects. This of course cannot be achieved overnight; it will need five, ten, perhaps fifteen years. However, nothing is accomplished without a first step - which you have taken. This starts mutual co-operation for the future of our railway heritage: open the regulator in full forward gear!

Schedule for Launch

We are 'lighting up the engine' to launch the organisation in Spring 2013. This will be done through discussions and resolutions on-line and at our Working Group assemblies as part of our Annual Conference.

We will discuss and pass resolutions for objectives, administration, and a membership programme at our next conference in Indonesia.

Other business from 2012 will be discussed at the next assembly; then resolutions and a final vote to launch the organisation is planned for the conference next year.

Our first conference is planned to be held in Indonesia, 7-11 June 2012.

This will be the first gathering of Working Group members and a good opportunity to learn of their activities via their presentations. Guest speakers, WATTRAIN President Mr. David Morgan and Vice President Mr. Chris LeMarshall, will come and give presentations too.

One important item in the programme for this conference is the Working Group Assembly: we shall discuss the founding of a robust organisation and pass resolutions. This conference is also a good chance to can see the magnificent heritage railways and museums of Indonesia, most of which are operated by the Heritage and Conservation Department of Indonesian Railways.

Booking is open until the end of April. Of course you and any friends interested in heritage railways and museums will be warmly welcomed.
